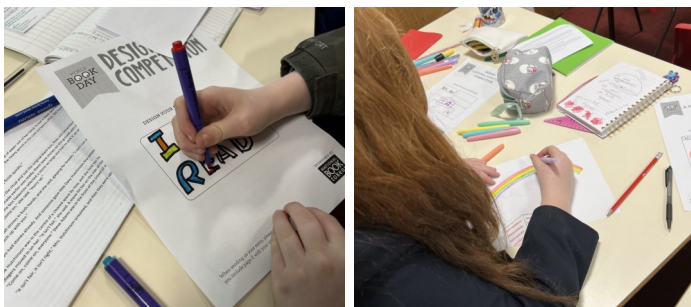

they manage to save the light.

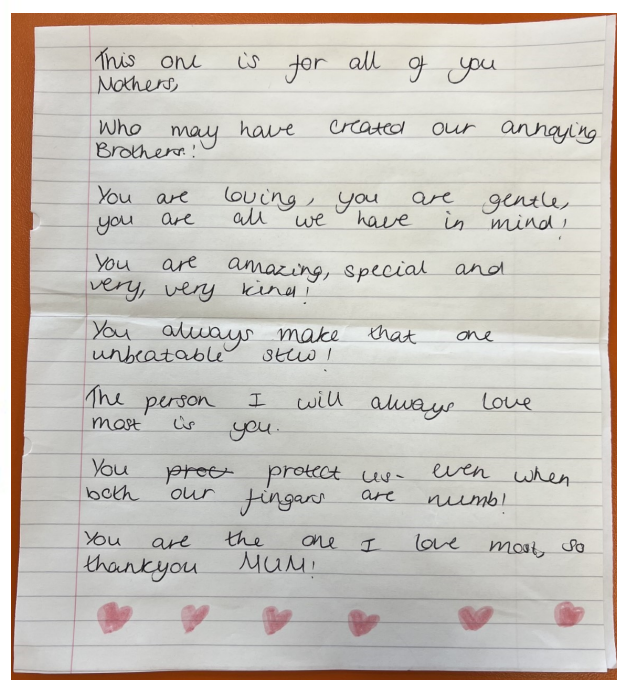
My garden is full of wonder,
